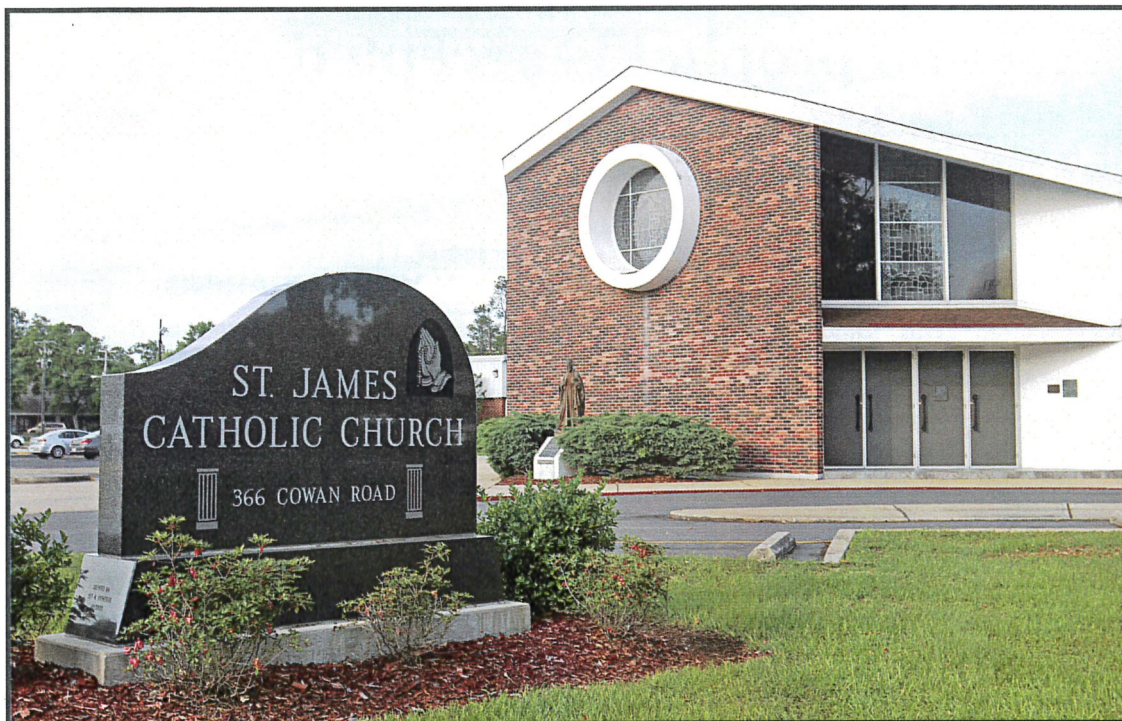

THE ABUNDANCE OF GOD'S LOVE

The crowd that followed Jesus to the deserted place was fed, body and spirit. Jesus wanted them to know that in his presence they would find care and compassion. He would not let them go hungry. Like Abram who encountered God in the bread and wine offered by Melchizedek, they experienced first-hand the abundance of God's love. These sacred meals prefigured the meal most profound, the supper shared by Jesus and his disciples on the night before he died, the feast in which we share in the Eucharist. Today we celebrate the solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. On this day, we appreciate anew the great love of Jesus Christ for us and for the world and experience first-hand the presence of Christ in the sacred meal.

TAKEN, BLESSED, BROKEN, SHARED

We do it so often, we could take it for granted. Yet, the mystery of the Eucharist, our participation in, reception of, and being sent to live as Christ's Body and Blood is a gift beyond measure. In the desert with the crowd and on the night of the Last Supper, Jesus took bread, gave thanks, said a prayer of blessing, broke the bread, and gave it to those who hungered for physical and spiritual nourishment. Scripture scholars and theologians often remind us that we are to repeat Jesus' actions of taking, blessing, breaking, and giving—with our lives, resources, and gifts—so that others may know the love of Christ. As Eucharistic people, we are meant to be changed, to become more like the One whom we receive.

GIVE THEM SOME FOOD YOURSELVES

Notice that Jesus sent his disciples to give the crowd the food they needed. Jesus could have done this alone. We could say he didn't need the disciples to participate in the feeding of the great crowd. But Jesus did not act alone then, and Christ relies on us now, to feed those who hunger and thirst physically, spiritually, and emotionally. When we grow weary and want nothing more than to satisfy our selfish and self-centered impulses, it is good for us to remember who we are and whose we are. It is crucial that we hear in the depths of our hearts, "Give them some food yourselves," and be ready to do so. On this solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, let us celebrate Christ's living presence with and for us and recognize our call to share that presence with others.

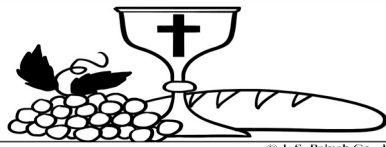

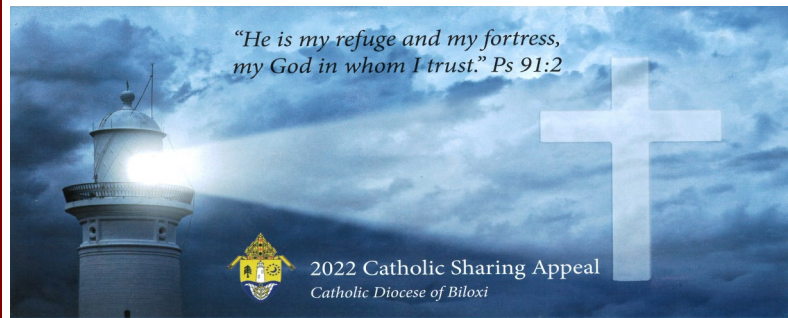

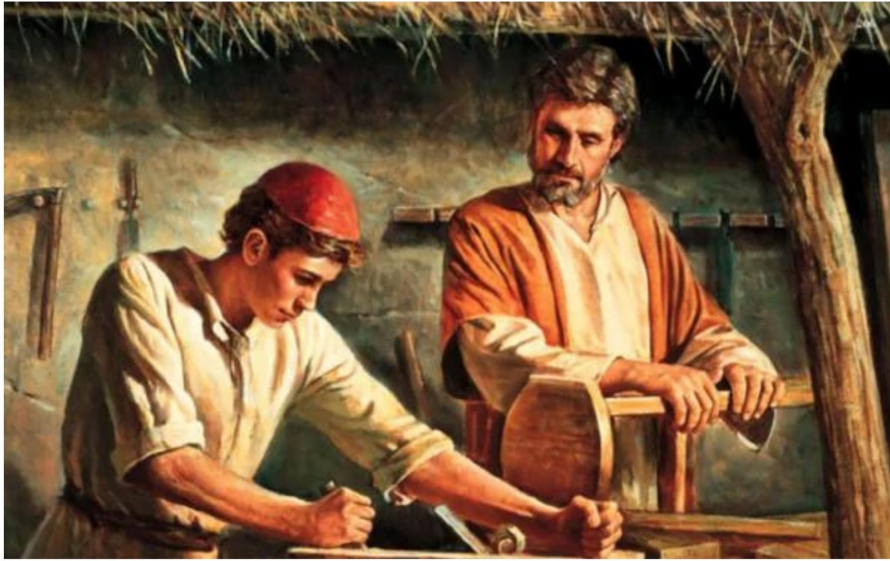

Upcoming Feast Days

The Catechism of the Catholic Church states that “From the time of the Mosaic law, the People of God have observed fixed feasts, beginning with Passover, to commemorate the astonishing actions of the Savior God, to give him thanks for them, to perpetuate their remembrance, and to teach new generations to conform their conduct to them. In the age of the Church, between the Passover of Christ already accomplished once for all, and its consummation in the kingdom of God, the liturgy celebrated on fixed days bears the imprint of the newness of the mystery of Christ.” (CCC 1164)

In this coming week, the liturgical calendar is sprinkled with special celebrations.

Thursday, June 23 – the Solemnity of the Nativity of Saint John the Baptist

Mass at 7:00 AM and 12:00 Noon

This feast, which dates to the fourth century, came to be celebrated in accord with Luke 1:36 (“... and this is the sixth month with her who was called barren.”). Accordingly, the Church celebrates his natural birth assigned exactly six months before the nativity of Christ, since John was six months older than the Lord. Quoting John 3:30 (“He must increase, but I must decrease.”), St. Augustine found this date (near the summer solstice) appropriate for, after the birth of John, daylight begins to grow shorter, whereas after Jesus’ birth, it begins to increase.

Some fun facts: Saints’ feast days are usually celebrating the day of their death, marking their birthday into heaven—the first day of their eternal reward; however, the Church celebrates St. John’s birth and his death (August 29). The only other births that are celebrated in the Church’s liturgical calendar are the birth of Jesus on December 25 and the birth of his Blessed Mother on September 8.

Friday, June 24 – the Solemnity of the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus

Mass at 8:30 AM

This is a moveable feast that honors the Sacred Heart. In 1675, Jesus told St. Margaret Mary that He wanted the Feast of the Sacred Heart to be celebrated on the Friday after the Corpus Christi octave. In 1856, the Feast of the Sacred Heart became a universal feast. It is now one of the most widespread devotions to Jesus.

Pope St. John Paul II, a great devotee of the Sacred Heart, said, “This feast reminds us of the mystery of the love of God for the people of all times.”

Saturday, June 25 – the Memorial of the Immaculate Heart of the Blessed Virgin Mary

Mass at 8:30 AM

The Immaculate Heart of Mary signifies, first of all, the great purity and love of the heart of the Blessed Virgin Mary for God. This purity is manifested in her “Yes” to the Father at the Incarnation; her love for, and cooperation with, the Incarnate Son in His redemptive mission; and her docility to the Holy Spirit, enabling her to remain free of the stain of personal sin throughout her life. Mary’s Immaculate Heart, therefore, points us to her profound interior life, where she experienced both joys and sorrows, yet remained faithful, as we, too, are called to do.

The history of devotion to the Immaculate Heart isn’t as extensive as the Sacred Heart; however, following the apparitions at Fatima in 1917, devotion to the Immaculate Heart of Mary became very widespread. On the twenty-fifth anniversary of the apparitions (1942), Pius XII consecrated the Church and the human race to the Immaculate Heart of Mary and extended the memorial to the entire Church. It is celebrated on the Saturday immediately following the Solemnity of the Sacred Heart of Jesus.
