



Gospel Meditation Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

A man looking a bit downtrodden approached me as I filled my car's gas tank. He asked, "May I share with you my testimony about how good God is?" "OK," I skeptically answered. He went on to tell me that he had been an alcoholic and drug addict, and that God had healed him; now he was four years sober. He said, "I didn't deserve it, but now I'm a different person. God is so good! Have a terrific Tuesday!" A few minutes later, as I drove away, I saw him smiling and handing a homeless person some money. I was confronted with a choice: either he was a total fraud or God had changed him. Something had happened to him, and it didn't seem fake. Maybe it was God.

When Jesus heals the man born blind, the man becomes a challenge to everyone who meets him. They must decide. Is he the same blind person who they knew before? Who healed him and how? And what is the status of the one who can heal such infirmities? We shouldn't be surprised at the storm of doubt, hatred and animosity that swirls around the healed man — so it often goes when Jesus heals someone even to this day.

Like we often do, the religious leaders confronting the healed man declare that God is not at work. They ask with mocking superiority and dismissive disdain, "You were born totally in sin, and are you trying to teach us?" (John 9:34). And they cast him out. When Jesus clearly works in our lives, in us or around us, we should accept it, and give praise and thanks for this wonderful manifestation of his goodness.

Lenten challenge: Think of one way the Lord has healed you. Perhaps he healed a form of selfishness, a physical ailment, or something else. This week, find a person to whom you can share that testimony, and share it. Don't worry if they don't accept it was God who did it.



The Easter Vigil in the Holy Night a 7:27PM: The entire celebration of the Easter Vigil must take place at night and is arranged in four parts: after a service of light and the Easter Proclamation (I), the church meditates on all the wonderful things God has done for his people from the beginning; this is the Liturgy of the Word (II). As the day of Resurrection approaches, new members of the Church are reborn in Baptism (III), and the whole Church is called to the table of the Lord prepared for his people through his Death and Resurrection; this is the Liturgy of the Eucharist (IV).

<u>Perpetual Adoration Chapel:</u> On Good Friday and Holy Saturday, the Church meditates on the Passion and Death of our Lord. Therefore, the Perpetual Adoration Chapel will be closed from 5:00PM on Holy Thursday until 2:00PM on Easter Sunday.

Please make every effort to attend the scheduled services during the Triduum.

I want to take a moment to share the results of our recent town hall meetings and parish survey. Your input has been invaluable in shaping the vision for our parish's future. We are deeply grateful for your thoughtful feedback, prayers, and commitment to the future of Saint James.

Through these conversations and surveys, we identified three key priorities that will enhance both our parish and school community:

- 1. Upgrading Our Pre-K School Facilities This includes much-needed improvements to existing spaces and establishing a permanent home for our Pre-K2 program, ensuring a strong foundation for our youngest learners.
- 2. Building a Parish Hall This long-awaited addition will serve as a dedicated space for parish ministries, youth programs, and St. Vincent de Paul outreach, while also providing flexible meeting areas and potential office space to support our growing community.
- 3. Constructing a Church Narthex This welcoming gathering space will enhance hospitality, and improve the overall flow of our worship experience.

To assess how we can bring these projects to life, we conducted a giving analysis, which suggests that our parish has the financial capacity to support a capital campaign. Based on this information and your feedback, we will now move forward with a mini-feasibility study to evaluate our ability to raise the funds needed for these vital improvements.

As we enter this next phase, your involvement is critical. We encourage you to stay engaged, ask questions, and share your thoughts. In the coming weeks, we will provide regular updates, opportunities for further discussions, and ways you can contribute—whether through prayer, participation, or financial support.

Together, as a faith-filled community, we have the opportunity to create a stronger, more vibrant future for Saint James. Thank you for your dedication to our parish and school, and for being part of this journey with us.



CATHOLIC SCHOOL SUBSIDY

To obtain the Catholic rate at St. James Catholic School and/or St. Patrick Catholic High School, one must be a registered and participating family who regularly contributes to Saint James Parish (using checks, parish envelopes or electronic giving). Each school year, parents must bring a subsidy form from the school to the parish office for the pastor to sign in order to receive the subsidized tuition rate.

TUITION ASSISTANCE

Parents are responsible before God to choose appropriate schooling for each of their children. Our task, as a parish community, is to assist parents as best we can with the tools they need to raise their children as good Catholics. Each year, our parish is assessed a certain percentage of our Sunday collection to be allocated to our local Catholic schools, St. James Catholic School and St. Patrick Catholic High School. As such, Saint James Parish has money set aside in the 2025/2026 budget for our registered contributing families to help with Catholic elementary and high school tuition costs.

At Saint James, our policy is also to set aside a proportional amount to support our faith formation programs for parents who choose public schools or home schooling for their children.

We follow a "needs based" policy. Both schools utilize FACTS, an organization that specializes in determining the financial need of each family. The Tuition Assistance application process is now open. There is a processing fee.
